Resilient Mindful Learner Pilot Project has a two-fold aim: Increase teachers' mind-body wellness by promoting resilience and stress management and increase students' resilience, emotional self-regulation, and healthy stress management skills for academic and social/emotional development.

- Train and support teachers to prevent and manage personal and professional stress and build their resilience and mindfulness skills
- Train and coach teachers about student stress, its mind-body impact and teaching practices to prevent and reduce student stress and build emotional regulation, self-management and mindful awareness skills
- Monitor and document integration of skills practice into classroom management routines
- · Support teachers to demonstrate the practice with students and school colleagues

- Conduct pilot using refined survey questions in Year 2

Multi-tiered behavioral interventions to enhance systems of support for all students (behavioral and academic) using Comprehensive Student Assistance-Ready Model to include Professional Development in *Ready to Learn (RTL)*, *Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)* and *Building Effective Schools Together (BEST)*.

- Offer multiple days of training for district and site staff in utilizing multi-tiered systems of support
- Provide ongoing technical assistance during implementation phases
- Provide training in use of student data
- Offer BEST and PBIS training to new sites to begin implementation
- Monitor implementation of the multi-tiered models
